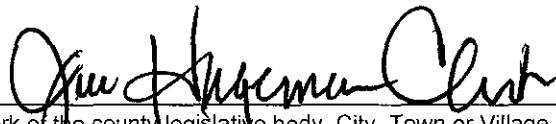

LOCAL LAW #6 of 2026

A LOCAL LAW titled **Town of Clay Local Law # 6** and known as the "**Temporary Moratorium**" prohibiting any zone change or special permit applications related to solar battery storage systems in the Town of Clay.

IT IS HEREBY ORDAINED AND ENACTED by the Town Board of the Town of Clay, Onondaga County, New York, as follows:

That Town of Clay Local Law # 6 titled "Temporary Moratorium" is hereby adopted to enact a six (6) month moratorium prohibiting the application or approval of any new zoning requests or special permits related to solar battery storage systems.

The purpose of said local law is to provide for a temporary moratorium against the consideration of any and all applications for zone changes, special permits, and other development related land use decisions related to solar battery storage systems in the Town to allow time for the Town Board to research and consider the adoption of new Town Code provisions related to battery storage systems. This temporary moratorium may be further amended, extended or terminated by the Town Board. Said local law reads as follows:

LOCAL LAW

“Town of Clay Local Law No. 6 is hereby enacted, providing for a Temporary Moratorium, for a period of six (6) months after the date of filing of this Local Law.

SECTION 1. *PURPOSE*

The purpose of said local law provides for a Temporary Moratorium for six (6) months after the date of the filing of this Local Law.

SECTION 2. *TIME PERIOD AND PROHIBITION*

- A. As of the effective date of this local law there will be a six (6) month moratorium on all Town Board land use decisions related to solar battery storage systems in Clay.

SECTION 3. *EFFECTIVE DATE*

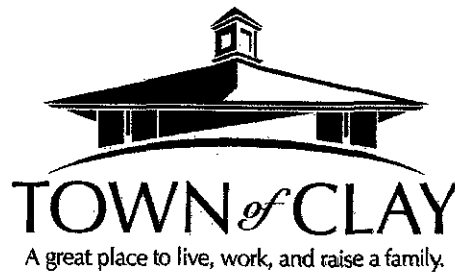
This Local Law shall take effect immediately upon filing with the Secretary of State.

SECTION 4. *TERMINATION DATE*

This local law shall become null and void six (6) months after filing, unless extended or terminated by the Town Board. The proposed moratorium may be extended, or terminated at any earlier period, by the Town Board.

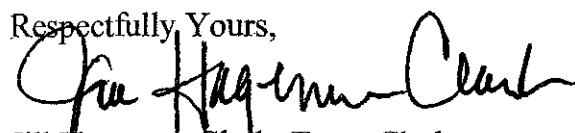
